Interview With Coach Barker

1. **Key to Success This Season:** The main factor seems to be the growth in team culture. The program has made strides in understanding the system and being able to layer in more advanced strategies, which was harder to do in the past when everything was new. The players now have a confident mindset—winning is expected, not hoped for.

The defense is also noted for its speed and toughness.

2. **Season Goals:** While some goals have been met, like winning the district, the team is focused on the bigger prizes: breaking the playoff drought (last win was 2005), playing into Thanksgiving weekend, and ideally winning a state title. The focus remains on consistent improvement and discipline.

3. **Key Players:** Several players have stood out for their toughness, including Xavier Randall, who's playing through injury with a physical style. Freshman Brayden Black is also praised for his ability to hold his own against much larger opponents. The offensive line gets special mention as they do a lot of the "dirty work" that supports the rest of the team.

4. **Mindset of the Team:** The mentality is all about "Eat, Effort, Attitude, Toughness." This comes from a mix of influences, notably from McAllister and Coach Mazey, who borrow from other successful programs.

The idea is that you can't control everything, but if you control your effort, attitude, and toughness, you always have a chance. It's about being able to play through pain and push past discomfort, whether it's physical or mental.

5. **Toughness as a Philosophy:** The importance of playing through injury and showing up consistently is central to the team's ethos. It's not about "look at me" but about contributing when it's your turn. The mindset is focused on working hard without making a big deal about personal struggles.

“To give students access to books that they may not have at home. Also, research libraries are important to give students access to information that is static and cannot be edited.”




