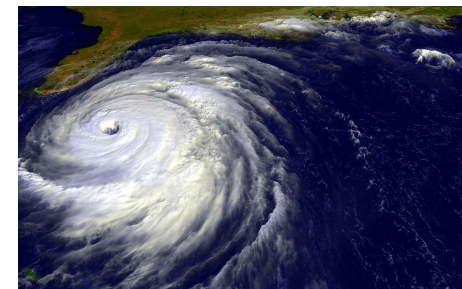

Hurricane Frances made a landslide in Terrebonne Parish Louisiana September 11, 2024. The storm in Louisiana Brought 5-7 inches of rain to New Orleans and flooded the streets they rescued 26 families trapped by the rising water. Heavy rain fell in parts of the Florida Panhandle with up to 10 inches possible in some areas. The storm also brought heavy rain to Mississippi, Arkansas, Tennessee, Alabama, and Georgia bringing it up to 6 inches.

Because of the heavy rain in some places lost power over 318,000 customers did. Also, high winds toppled trees and it caused a whole bunch of storm damage. Governor Ron Desantis and First Lady Casey announced funding to repair homes and meet the unmet needs of Hurricanes that impacted residents. The State of Florida placed the first travel trailer in the new temporary housing and sheltering programs for Hurricane survivors.

How do you feel being a senior now?

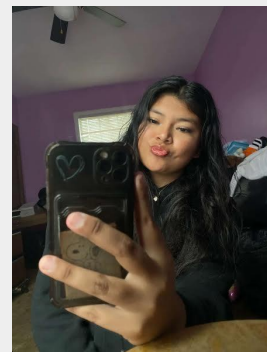
I feel excited and sad because i'm ready to be growing up and at the same time I'm not.

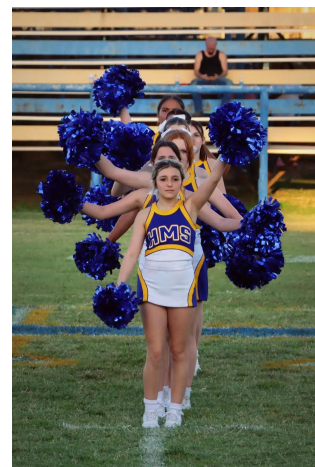

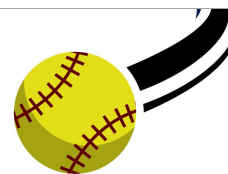
How are the games for the girls so far? Do you think they're doing well?
